Autumn is a great time of year to explore Norfolk.
Here's Woodstock Park's top things to do this time of year.



WOODLAND WALKS

There's no better way to enjoy Autumn's beautiful falling leaves than to go on a woodland walk. Woodstock Park has its very own woodland walk on the farm but if you would like to go further Thetford Forest, Shouldham Warren and Sandringham Estate are great places to explore.

MIGRATING BIRDS

Autumn is when many migrating birds flock to Norfolk, on their journey South. Bird hides at RSPB Snettisham offer panoramic views of The Wash. If you visit when the high tides come in you will witness 'the whirling wader spectacular' when thousands of birds are forced off the mud flats from the rising tide and swirl beautifully in the sky. One of nature's most fantastic displays! As winter approaches swans and ducks begin to gather at Welney. Visit at sunset to experience the wild swan feeds.

NORFOLK BEACHES & COASTAL PATH

Autumn is a lovely time to enjoy Norfolk's beautiful uncrowded beaches such as Holkham, Wells-Next-The-Sea and Hunstanton. If you enjoy hiking the Norfolk Coastal Path is a long-distance footpath running 83 miles from Hunstanton to Hopton-on-Sea. There is a Coasthopper bus so you can do stretches of the path and return back to your car.



SEALS AND PUPS

Towards the end of Autumn and during the Winter months the grey seals come to shore to give birth. There are two places on the Norfolk coast where you can view the newborn seal pups on the beach - Horsey beach and Blakeney Point. It's a great experience.

STARGAZING

With the evenings starting to draw in and still fairly warm Autumn is a good time to stargaze. Wrap up warm with a hot chocolate and admire the beautiful twinkly sky. Listen and look out for the Tawny, Barn and Little Owl at Woodstock Park.

NATIONAL TRUST OXBURGH HALL

Oxburgh Hall is a striking stately home surrounded by beautiful gardens and woodlands. This magnificent moated Tudor manor dates back to the 15th Century and is full of history. Oxburgh hall is located 5 miles from Woodstock Park and is a lovely walk or cycle ride passing through Boughton village.

FISHING

Woodstock Farm fishing lake is set in peaceful, beautiful surroundings with an abundance of wildlife. The 2 acre lake is stocked with Bream, Roach, Rudd, Perch, Chubb, Green Tench and various Carp ranging from F1's to 30lb plus. A perfect Autumnal relaxing day.



HALLOWEEN FUN

There are some great events running this Autumn in Norfolk such as The Real Halloween, BeWilderedwood Glowing Lantern Parade, PrimEvil at Roarr! Dinosaur Park, King's Lynn and Norwich ghost walks, Fairview Events Pumpkin Patch, Rusty's Great Pumpkin Patch at Worzals, Skylark Week of Wickedness, The Pumpkin House, Pensthorpe Pumpkin Festival and Church Farm goes to outer space.

COUNTRY PUB MEAL
